

ISG STUDENTS EXCEL AT WORLD SCHOLARS CUP HELD AT YALE UNIVERSITY IN USA

The students of Indian School Al Ghubra had the proud privilege of winning gold and silver medals at the 'Tournament of Champions', the Final Round of this year's World Scholars Cup that was held at Yale University in the US. The theme was 'An Unlikely World'. The students were tested for their writing, debating and quizzing skills in the four team events known as Collaborative Writing, Scholar's Bowl, Scholar's Challenge and Team Debate.

This annual mega event is conducted in 3 Rounds. The Regional Round was held at British School Muscat in which many schools from the region participated enthusiastically. 12 students from ISG qualified for the Global Round which was held in Athens, Greece in which about 1500 students participated. After a keenly contested round, eight students of ISG- Alisha Amjad, Aparna Krishnan Reshmy, Faiza Reza, Khadija Akbar, Kshama Mumbai, Nikitha Manoj Thomas, Nitu Andrews Machilath and Roshna Sharon Manogaran qualified for and participated in the Final Round. After much preparation involving hardwork and perseverance, the students of ISG came home with a rich harvest of medals. They won 8 gold medals, fourteen silver medals for their knowledge, writing and debating skills.
